Details on Ms. Hansen's presentation:

America's most famous architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, was born in 1867 in the rolling hills of Richland Center, Wisconsin, to a family of Unitarians. Bay View-based journalist Kristine Hansen authored a comprehensive guide for Globe Pequot Press about Wright's designs (and those of his protégés) that are open to the public—as well as insider historical information about sites now demolished, and those available for "drive-bys" only. Learn more about Wright's Milwaukee-area projects, including stories from site managers as well as those who are lucky enough to live in his homes.
