Our Pastor's Voice

Nativity sets are one of my favorite Christmas traditions. In my husband's family, the characters had to be placed in geographically appropriate locations throughout the house. Mary and Joseph weren't allowed to be in the manger until Christmas Eve. Instead, for the whole of Advent, they "travelled" from a windowsill on the north side of the house (Nazareth) southward to the nativity set (Bethlehem). The Magi came from the east on a similar journey and made stops at bookshelves and coffee tables along the way. In the living room sat the manger complete with

cows and sheep—just waiting for Jesus to arrive.

I love nativity sets because they spark the imagination. What must it have been like to give birth in a barn? Were there chickens, cows and goats? How many shepherds showed up that night? Hundreds of years ago, Saint Francis of Assisi (the patron saint of

animals) had his imagination sparked by a trip to Bethlehem. After visiting the site of Jesus' birth, he wanted to bring that powerful experience to the people he served back home. So, in a cave near Greccio, Italy the first live nativity was held in the year 1223. And, of course, that first nativity included animals. Sometimes I forget that those animals weren't there as props—they weren't present in the stable that night to make the nativity set in my living room cute—those animals were hard-working sources of food and clothing for real people.





In the spirit of that first Christmas Eve, Saint

Matthew's will be making a special collection for the ELCA's Good Gifts campaign. This ministry of the wider church listens to communities in need and supplies them with resources that will make an impact in their daily life. It is one example of the ways in which the church can make a big difference when we work together. A gift of \$10 buys a baby chick for a family farm. \$50

buys a goat that provides fresh milk. Honeybees, piglets, and cows are also available! In this season of counting blessings and pondering the gifts we've received, I invite you to support our brothers and sisters around the globe through this worthy ministry. Just imagine the nativity set we'll build together!


2023 Year End Giving




appointments and community errands. Thank you to all who provided assistance, especially Carl & Petey Lund and Don & Jill Schaeffer.
