Scams: Even the church and its staff are targets -- What to watch for:

If you receive a text or an email from someone from St. Matthew's, and it sounds a little odd, look for these red flags:

- Check the sender's email is it familiar? or is it only similar to their email
- Does it ask for gift cards or money or personal information?
- Is there a rush for you to respond?

If you see these red flags, beware! If you ever aren't sure about a contact that's been made using a staff member's name, check with the church office, or send an email directly to the person (not a reply to the suspicious email), using the email address you know to be correct, asking if they contacted you.

We hope these steps will prevent you from being 'scammed'! Please reach out to any staff member if you have questions or concerns.

Etiquette and Ethics with our Church Directory

Our church directory is a powerful tool for people to be in touch with other members. We encourage these contacts for church connections and for personal reasons. However, if you are a business person, using the church directory for solicitations, or even informational emails about your business, is not appropriate, and discouraged. We keep the church directory secure from the public, and our members

trust that their contact infomation is not going to be used for unsolicited emails or texts that don't relate to church business. Please keep this in mind as you use the directory. Thank you.



- · University \$1600


