## Pastor's Voice The Holy Spirit equips us to share the good news

On May 28th the church celebrated the Day of Pentecost. We read from the Book of Acts that a violent wind entered the place where the disciples were staying. Tongues of flame rested on their heads and they began to speak in different languages. The details; wind, flame and an immediate ability to speak a language you've never studied—tend to overshadow the rest of the story. What's more, this year Pentecost happened over Memorial Day weekend. So I thought that this momentous church festival needed a little extra attention.

Yes, the disciples are able to speak in the languages of the crowd gathered in Jerusalem. But what kind of conversations are they having? They are given this surprising gift—the gift of communication—in order to share the good news of God's "deeds of power." Pentecost is about sharing the good news with others. And what is that good news? Jesus, the Son of God, has come to free us from sin and death. The world killed him but death did not win. The Spirit that was poured out onto all of us at Pentecost isn't just any old spirit—it is the Spirit of the risen, resurrected Christ. Which means... the hard work is done. Jesus has already been raised from the dead. Now as disciples of Jesus, we go tell the story. The Spirit of God is loose in the world. It lives in the community at Saint Matthew's and it lives in you.

This year at our staff and council retreat in February, we began to focus on the word "equipping." That word is part of Saint Matt's mission statement to "Welcome, Nurture, Equip and Send" but it is also a perfect word for the season of Pentecost. Through the miracle of Pentecost and the sacrament of baptism you have the authority to live as Jesus lived, love as Jesus loved and work to help make the Kingdom of God a reality. You are equipped. You have exactly what you need—the Holy Spirit.

Which means that you, Beloved, are the ministers of Saint Matthew's. The staff's job is to make sure your witness, passion, service, study, etc. go smoothly. Let us be a Pentecost People. Use the Spirit given to you. Tell the story.

As usual, a box lunch will be available at a suggested donation of \$11/person. Guests and friends are welcome always. Sign up at the Welcome Center or in the church office.


#### No Saints meeting in July

## Run to Rebuild Mission Trip Happens this Month

On June 18th, 31 teens and adults will board a bus early in the morning and head to Hazard, Kentucky to work in Appalachian communities to rebuild and repair homes that were damaged by record floods last summer. Here is an overview of our annual week of service:

Why Kentucky?

- A "1,000 year" flood inundated much of East Kentucky on July 28, 2022, taking over 40 lives and damaging approximately 10,000 homes.
- Over 2,000 homes are estimated to have been completely destroyed or uninhabitable.
- Many homeowners struggle financially and are not able to replace their homes. The poverty rate for Appalachian Kentucky counties is 25.4% compared to 11.6% for the U.S. as a whole.
- Hundreds of survivors are still displaced, living in travel trailers, hotel rooms at state parks, staying with family, or even living in unheated, flood-damaged homes or in tents.
- Recovery from this disaster will take years, long after the media attention disappears.



#### What Will We Do?

We will work with the Housing Development Alliance of Hazard, KY (see information below) to build new homes for flood survivors or repair homes damaged by the floods.



#### What is the Housing Development Alliance?

It is a nonprofit affordable housing developer located in Eastern Kentucky. Our mission is to use the power of housing to transform lives and build a brighter future for our community.

intended to represent the mystery as well as the beauty of the Holy Spirit as it moves in the life of our congregation. We celebrate 30 years of Pentecost celebrations (and seasons after Pentecost each summer) with this work of art gracing our worship space.

## **My Prayer Shawl**

Pain. That's what scared me most about the surgery I was facing at the end of December. I'd never had an operation before and I had no idea what to expect. The doctor told me that some pain after a hysterectomy was normal and that it might take six weeks before I felt like myself again. He was trying to reassure me, but by the time I got home from the pre-op appointment, I was shaking. I headed straight for my bedroom, for the recliner where I prayed every morning. I sat down and, by reflex, reached behind me for my prayer shawl. It was one of a kind, handmade in a gorgeous range of pastel colors-mauve, pink, green, blue, gray, like the predawn sky. I needed to feel its softness around me, to feel the love and prayers that had been knit into it. That had always brought me comfort, even when my previous husband was dying. Did you know that St. Matthew's has a prayer shawl ministry? Those in our congregation may be in need of extra comfort, and a prayer shawl would provide such security. Because of this we are looking for assistance in helping to knit some prayer shawls to keep an ample inventory. **Shirley Kaisler** died April 30, 2023. She was a beloved longtime member of St. Matthew's,




