Sometimes this means things don't go as planned or we make mistakes. But mostly I mean God is here working on us, in us, through us. God is pouring out upon us comfort, grace, forgiveness. We are hearing God's truth, receiving guidance and exhortation. We are being inspired and empowered.

And in our worship, God is

connecting us to something bigger than ourselves. We are sharing a common need for a Savior. When we share scripture, songs, creeds, prayer, the meal, we share a common understanding of what God has done through Jesus Christ. We share a common purpose of what God is doing NOW through Christ's Church and for the world Christ loves by giving his life.

But there's more to worship. God comes to us, and then we respond. Not only with our thanks and praise but also by offering to God all that we are and all that we have. We renew our sense of being sent to serve.

That's why participating in Sunday worship is always my first priority for you. Only God can heal you, help you, show you what is best for your life, and lead you to be a part of something bigger than yourself.

When someone does not show up, the work still needs to be done, so we have to find someone to fill that position. Waiting is a fact of life. Waiting does not mean that you lie down and do nothing. Waiting is not an encouragement to inaction or to indifference and

indecision. It takes a lot of work with diligent and regular practice, and persistent hope that refuses to be deterred by having to wait. Waiting for a wedding is a time of eager



excitement. A lot has to be done to get ready, and the whole family is wrapped up in the process. You don't learn to play a musical instrument overnight. It takes a lot of hard work, and a lot of waiting.

October Call Committee Update

The Call Committee released an update last month which was distributed by email and in the Sunday bulletin. We print it here for anyone who has not yet seen it.

Learn why this process has been a slow one. Much of the process depends on receiving names of qualified candidates, and there simply aren't as many candidates available as there once was, for many reasons. More details on this are included below.

The Call Committee was formed and trained by the Synod in the fall of 2021.

In December 2021, the Call Committee received its first pool of candidates, and to date, it has received and interviewed 19 vetted candidates from the Synod. Of those, two of the candidates withdrew their names from consideration. We also had two candidates

with whom we conducted multiple interviews, and each time, we thought we had found our candidate of choice. However, this process is a two-way dis-cernment, and in each case, the candidates prayerfully discerned that, after going through the pro-cess, they still felt that God was calling them to continue in their current ministries. While disap-pointed, we firmly believed in each case that God's hand was guiding this process, that He had an-other plan for us, and that we needed to continue interviewing.

Another factor that has prolonged the process not only for us but for churches across America is the shortage of ordained pastors not only in the ELCA but also in all denominations. Bishop Paul Erickson has informed us that approximately 500 ELCA pastors are retiring each year while only 200 men and women are graduating from seminary each year. Despite this, the Call Committee is committed to finding the right pastor for St. Matt's, not just fill the spot. We continue to believe that God is working through us and continue to pray for His guidance in our search. We will continue to be tenacious and hopeful in our efforts to call a candidate who has the blend of experience, vision and passion for ministry we seek and who will walk alongside us in our faith journey.

This has been a lengthy journey in search of our new lead pastor – one that has not occurred at St. Matt's for fifty years. More recently, the search for a full-time associate pastor in the early 2000's took nearly two years. There is a synodical process which we must follow in obtaining candidates. In recent conversations with Bishop Erickson and Pr. Kristin Nielsen, the Assistant to the Bishop for Congregations in Mission, we have been assured that they will also continue to be diligent in their vetting of candidates for us and will support us in any way they can. As Pastor Gary Erickson said in his sermon for our 100th anniversary, it's in God's own hands...in Kairos time. It is with regret that, due to family obligations and increased job responsibilities that often take him out-of-town, Andy Cherney has resigned from the Call Committee. He has been a valuable member of the team, bringing his perspective and insight to our search for St. Matt's new lead pastor. The committee will miss him and the positive leadership and energy he brought to the team. We, as a Church

Council and congregation, appreciate all his time, effort, and dedication to his commitment in finding the right candidate for our congregation and offer prayers of thanksgiving for his faithful service. I am happy to announce the David Celata has graciously agreed to join the Call Committee in its continued search for a new lead pastor. The Call Committee looks forward to working together as we interview and evaluate potential candidates as they become available. We invite the congregation to

continue to join us in prayer as we move forward in our search for a lead pastor.

When you need someone to talk to

Is something bothering you? Do you need someone to talk to? Is a life difficulty more than you can handle? Talking about our problems and verbalizing our feelings has been a proven source of relief for centuries. Health studies tell us that simply talking about our problems and sharing our negative emotions with someone we trust can be profoundly healing—reducing stress, strengthening our immune system, and reducing physical and emotional distress. Our faith gives us the same message, as in Galatians 6: "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ."

Everyone goes through difficult times. Talking about our struggles with someone who has a listening, empathetic ear can give us new perspectives. Sometimes we just need to let out how we're feeling with no real plan for a solution. "I had the worst day at work!" can be the start of a conversation that helps us process the stress of a hard day. Being open about our feelings is also important. Trying to resist painful emotions can increase our emotional suffering. When we open-up to what is happening to us, we can cultivate the positive aspects of our lives.

9th Graders to be Confirmed on Nov. 12th

This year's 9th grade class will be confirmed at a special service of confirmation on November 12th at 1:30. Confirmation is also known as affirmation of baptism, so 9th graders have spent the fall looking at the promises that were made for them by their parents at baptism and that they will make for themselves at confirmation – the promises that essentially speak to how we live as followers of Jesus:

- · to live among God's faithful people,
- to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper.
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
- and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.


