## Children in Worship: Come Visit the PRAY GROUND!

It is a place for young kids to engage in drawing, writing, blocks and other activities during the worship service, and close enough to the altar so they can see what is happening during worship. We are going to try it out this fall, and adjust as the weeks go on.

Children experience worship with all of their senses (the rest of us do too, by the way!) Even when it looks like they are not paying perfect attention, they are picking up the sights, smells and sounds of the sanctuary. This new space means that kids can be cared for AND absorb as much of the worship service as possible.
