It's Reformation Sunday, when we celebrate our heritage and the life of Martin Luther, a German pastor, theologian and reformer whose work and writings led to the formation of today's Lutheran church.

### Keys to the Reformation

**J**ustification by faith, according to Luther and the other Protestant reformers, is the key to the Scripture, the Christian faith and the Reformation. It means simply taking hold of God's promise [that's

faith] that God accepts us as righteous because of Christ [that's justification]. **R**ighteousness of God: the perfect goodness of God by which he justifies us through faith.

The three Reformation *Solas* [Sola is Latin for "alone."]

- **By Scripture alone** only God's Word is our sure guide for faith and life, not the teachings or traditions of the Church.
- **By faith alone** only faith or trust in God's promises, not our efforts, receives God's justification.
- **By grace alone** only through God's undeserved love are we made righteous, not also through the merits of humans saints or otherwise.

**Holy Communion:** All are welcome to come forward at the time of communion to receive God's gift of grace. Gluten free wafers as well as juice are available for those with specific dietary needs. Juice is available as an alternative to wine, in the center of each communion tray. Speak to an usher if you need assistance coming forward.
