Jay is a former ELCA pastor, now an attorney, who shared in this past Sunday's session some of his experiences leading congregations who were discerning how to intentionally welcome and celebrate the gifts of all of God's people.

At the end of this Sunday's session, there will be conversation about where the Holy Spirit is leading St. Matthew's and what else we might like to learn as we strive to grow in Christian love with curiosity, courage and compassion.
