

Isaiah tells us a young woman shall have a child and his name will be called Emmanuel.


O come, O come, Emmanuel.

God promises Elizabeth and Zechariah a child in their old age. But not just any child—one who would prepare the world for the coming of the messiah.





and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.


Invitation to Communion
