No! We want Barabbas!


So Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged, and the soldiers placed a crown of thorns on his head, dressed him in a purple robe and mocked him saying,

Welcome to Good Friday worship

"For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him" (John 3:17, ESV).

Introduction to Good Friday Worship: Protestant versions of Tenebrae service on Good Friday often have the inclusion of the last seven sayings of Jesus, assembled from the various gospel accounts. We read scripture and snuff out candles to represent the flight of the disciples and the approach of Jesus' enemies and the Passion of Christ. When the last passage has been read the church is dark. The Christ candle is carried out to signal Jesus' death and recalls the days when Jesus was in the tomb. We place the candle in the font at the entrance of the sanctuary to represent the hope of the prophecy of Easter.
