1 Corinthians 12 (MSG) “God’s various gifts are handed out everywhere; but they all originate in God’s Spirit. As the body of Christ, coming together for the work of ministry, we have completed a 2.5 million dollar renovation, and paid for it all in under 6 years - AMAZING! Thank you! High fives all around...

As we enter our 100th year here at St. Matthew’s, it is such a strong sense of who we are as a faith community that we are entering this milestone year debt free. Again - Thank you for your generosity! Thank you for taking on this endeavor with gusto! Thank you for doing the heavy lifting of the work that was set before us!

As we begin this next century of our ministry, may God continue to bless us with opportunities to serve Him, and may we have the ability and strength to work together - saying Harambe!
